



## UPPER SCHOOL PROFILE

Randolph's Upper School is an engaging, challenging environment for students in 9th through 12th grade. We are proud of our rigorous academic program, wide-ranging extracurricular activities, nurturing environment, and culture of trust.

Our college counseling office consists of two Co-Directors, Rusty Allen and Jessica Forinash, and a Registrar/College Counseling Assistant, Jenna Pirani. Combined, they have more than 42 years of experience. Starting in 9th grade through graduation, the college counseling team strives to give every student the preparation and individual guidance they need to find the right fit for their university experience.

Virtually all Randolph graduates attend four-year colleges. Here are some statistics from the most recent graduating class (2019):

- 58% of students scored 30 or higher on the ACT or equivalent SAT score.
- 100% of students who sought merit-based financial aid received it.
- 59% have completed courses in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics and 59% have completed Calculus.
- 38% have taken four years of foreign language at the Upper School level.

Randolph School holds dual accreditation from SAIS/AdvancEd and is a member of the National, Southern and Alabama Associations of Independent Schools; the National and Southern Association of College and Admissions Counselors; The College Board; the National Honor Society; and the Cum Laude Society.

## OUR STUDENT EXPERIENCE



We have 26 varsity teams playing 16 sports. 74% of our Upper School students participate in at least one sport, 35% play more than one sport.



The Upper School presents two major theater productions a year, as well as band and choir concerts. We offer a multitude of visual arts courses. 58% of recent graduating classes have taken four years of visual or performing arts.



All Randolph students adhere to a student-governed Honor System. The Community Learning Program connects them to meaningful service partnerships with organizations throughout North Alabama.



Interim Week gives every student the opportunity to take a wide array of trips, shadow various careers, and pursue service opportunities both locally and globally.

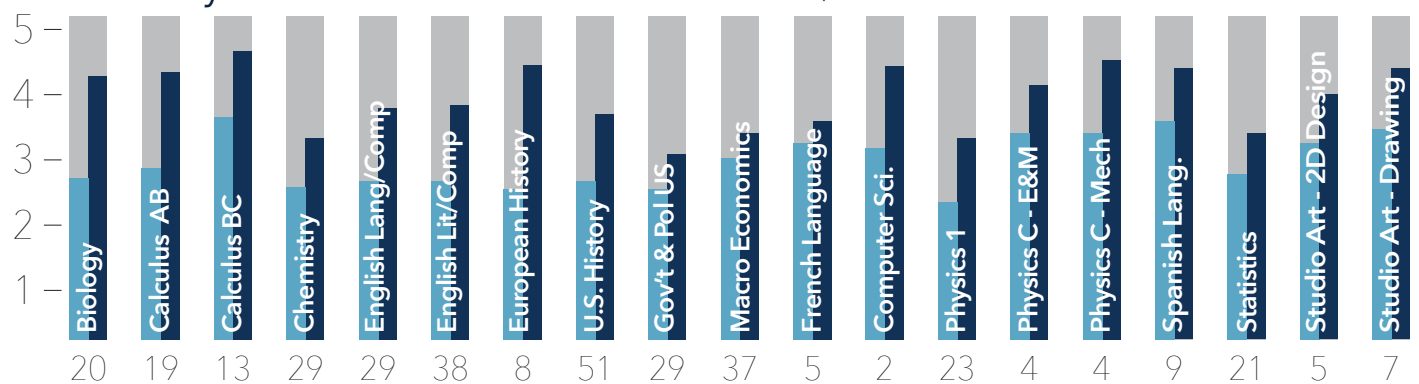
### AP GUIDANCE

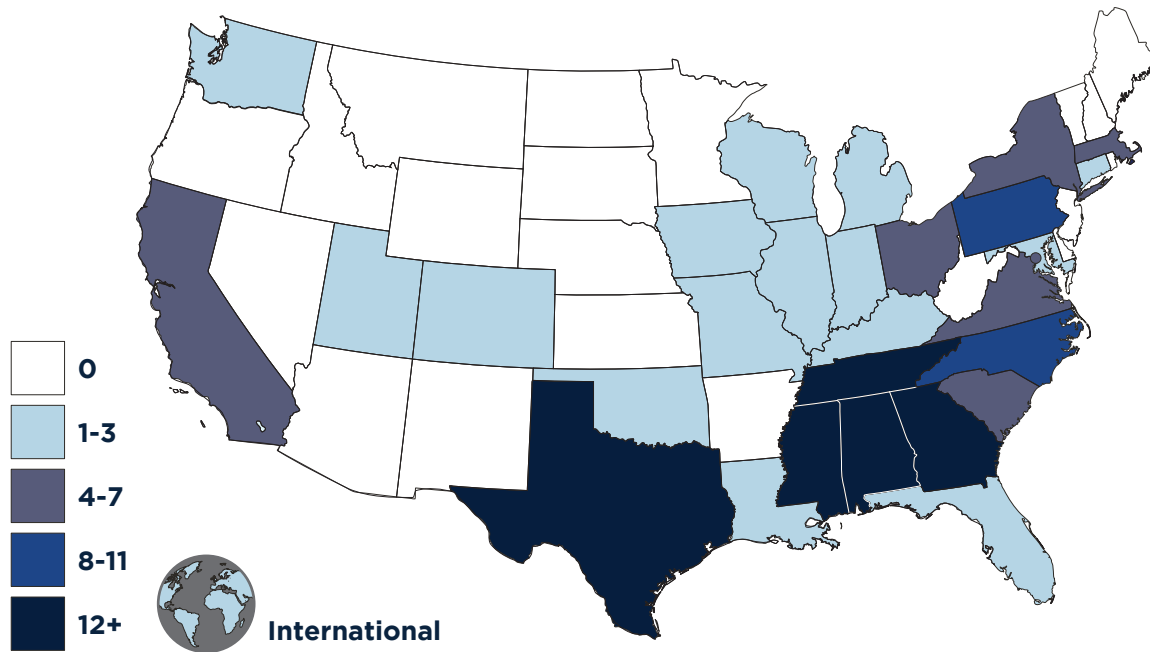
