

Books About Wearing Masks for Children

A cute little book that shows all the different places the animals are wearing their mask: bunny wears a mask at the grocery store, sheep at the doctor's office, frog at the airport, etc.




The Love Behind the Mask, by Lizy Toth

A Little SPOT of Anxiety: A Story About Calming Your Worries, by Diane Alber





The Social Distance King by Eric DeSio




A cute rhyming book that explains social distancing in simple terms for young children. Mentions mask wearing as well. The message is that you can still have fun and connect with people while social distancing.
